

Thirteen people enjoyed the chance to have a look around SAR base in Masterton and hear about the great work they do.


### 29 NOVEMBER FIREWOOD WORKING BEE

Closing balance \$6,821 plus \$15,191 in term deposits.


#### **FUNDRAISING**



# Rescheduled Akatarawa Forest Possum Control Project to February-March 2021

GWRC have previously notified the general public and neighbouring properties about an Akatarawa aerial possum control project and had advised that the project would be undertaken in November 2020. However they had not finished discussions with some adjacent occupiers for this project, so decided to reschedule the project until February-March 2021. More specifically, they are proposing to undertake the project in the following timeframe, although this will still be dependent on completing all the necessary preliminary work and suitable weather conditions:

- Pre-feed application between 16th February to 3rd March; and
- 1080 application, 9th March onwards (after the Karapoti Classic mountainbike event)

#### FIREARMS LICENCING

Police have now moved from the paper based system to a digital one for Firearms Licence applications and renewals. The single page hand written application to renew a Firearms Licence is no more. It has been replaced by an online 35 page pdf which applicants download from the Police website.

Members need to be aware that applications to renew their licences are now to be done on this form. The first two pages explain some workarounds for people who may not have access to the internet or the skills to complete a pdf on a computer. There is an option to print out the 35 pages and fill it in by hand and deliver it to the local police station.

Many members may need assistance from others to complete these forms or access to a computer and likely a printer.

These forms will be processed by Police after submission and the Police will then send questionnaires to the nominated referees. I have not seen the questionnaires, but they will most likely be sent via email to the referee and be in a similar, hopefully shorter, pdf format. After the initial internal assessment, Police will then send the complete and reviewed application and referee questionnaires electronically to the local Police Firearms Licence Vetting Officer who will, with the aid of a laptop computer, conduct face to face interviews with the applicant (new or renewing) and their referees. The Vetting Officer may receive directives for further enquiry to be carried out in the face to face interviews. The Police approach is now officially a regulatory rather than an administrative one.

Members would be advised to check the expiry date of their Firearms Licences and familiarise themselves with the new system. Quite a few collectors who had lifetime licences pre 1991 will find the 10 year cycle for renewal will approach in the next 2 to 4 years.

Perhaps members who are confident in computer use could offer their assistance to local members who are more uncertain. Branches might consider a buddy system for members to help other members.

I think it is important that senior members (who predominate in our Association) are not put off by this new technology. It would be a pity for collectors to withdraw from their lifelong interest because continuing looks too hard. It is in our collective interest (pun not intended!) to mutually support all members and not lose the knowledge our community shares.

I am also concerned that others in the wider firearms community might find the challenge of the digital application too difficult and thus opt out. There is a higher risk of non-compliance when something appears more difficult than before. We must, as law abiding licence holders, encourage all in the firearms owning community to meet their legal obligations. We should be prepared to help people maintain compliance.




