- **Photographic** special mention to junior Peter O'Driscoll for winning two first place awards in National competition.
- Huts frustration of working with DOC. Still trying to arrange maintenance work at Sayers.
- **Hunting opportunities** Wanganui trips continue to be popular and thanks to Andrew Wilkinson for coordinating. Fly-in trips disrupted due to Covid and weather. Disappointment that so few members took advantage of opportunity provided by Alfredton property lease. This will not be renewed.
- **Deer Park** thanks to Phil Gray, Paul Sayer, Andrew Dennes and Ray Wallace for all their efforts. Also to Masterton District Council for providing feed. Possible extension of area for third pen.
- **Firewood Working Bees** –still the club's major fundraiser. Thanks to Lloyd Rayner for arranging trees.
- **Memberships** steadily increasing.
- **Club nights** continued to encourage variety with King & Henry open night, smallbore shooting and SAR visit.
- **Hall** thanks to Sean Roberts and Gwyn Thurlow for their work with Parkvale Trust arranging transfer of land to Branch. Regular hires have paid for rates and insurance. Thanks to Gary & Liz Warren and the team at Valley Plumbing for new guttering.
- **Committee** Thanks to committee. Brad Gardner stepping down.

Treasurer's report

Sean Roberts presented the club's accounts. The financial statement was prepared by Bill Duncan Financial Services. Total society funds were \$116,158 made up of \$91,252 of assets, term deposits of \$15,614, and a cheque account balance of \$8,656. Total income for 2020/21 was \$11,638 which was made up mainly from firewood sales (\$3,652), memberships (\$965), and the annual dinner and auction (\$3,071). Annual expenditure was \$10,415 which included hall costs (insurance, rates, power etc) of \$3,658 and costs associated with the dinner (\$2,046). The net profit from annual dinner was just over \$1000. Income from memberships has decreased because of an increase in capitation from National Office.

Bill Duncan was re-appointed as auditor for 2021/22.

Subscription fees for 2022/23 were set. The AGM voted to keep the annual subscription all classes of membership at the same rates as 2021/22.
