Hutt Water Collection Area - Aerial 1080 Possum Control

I wish to advise you that Greater Wellington Regional Council (GWRC) will be undertaking a possum control operation in the Hutt Water Collection Area (WCA) in Kaitoke, using 1080 pellets aerially applied.


This work was intended to be treated in 2022 as part of a larger operation including the Kaitoke Regional Park. That work was not completed at the time because unsuitable weather conditions stopped the helicopters from continuing. The area treated last year is not going to be repeated this year.

This work is being done to protect significant natural sites within the Wellington Region, ensuring these natural habitats are healthy and able to support our native species and public water supplies. The operational area is ecologically diverse with eight different forest types, four wetlands, numerous major and minor watercourses, and sub-alpine and alpine flora present.

Possum control using 1080 has the additional benefit of controlling rats and stoats. Rats will die when they consume possum baits, while stoats will be killed when they consume the carcasses of poisoned rats and possums. A reduction of these introduced predators will further protect native plants and birds.

The tentative timeframe published for the operation is as follows:

- Apply prefeed cereal pellet baits from 2 May onwards.
- Apply 1080 cereal pellet baits from 9 May onwards:
 - Fine weather conditions are required for both applications, if to much wind or rain is forecast, delays will occur.
 - Current aircraft workloads and unsuitable long term weather forcasts are likely to delay the start dates until mid May.
