MEMBERSHIPS





Stewart Island Whitetail Deer

In June the Game Animal Council conducted a survey determine what white-tailed deer on Rakiura/Stewart Island mean to hunters. 619 hunters responded. The GAC were happy with the response. 610 parties were issued with hunting permits for conservation land during 2023. This is the third consecutive year the number of parties has exceeded 600. Of those 610 parties only 183 parties have bothered to take the 1 minute it takes to submit a Hunter Report after their hunt. That is less than 30%. If you hunted on the Island in 2023 check your party leader has put in a report and if not, get one done. It is not too late to do it now.

Ever wonder why those mature bucks are hard to find. Part of the answer is that quite simply you cannot get mature animals if you keep shooting the immature ones. The graph below is the first 1000 animals that John and Ray have aged by analysing their jawbones. The taking of bucks as opposed to does is very clear in that 2-8-year age grouping.

Game Animal Council: Better Hunting is live!

The Game Animal Council has just launched our brand-new online hunter training platform, Better Hunting, and it is available and free to use for hunters and other backcountry users. Those new to hunting or wishing to further develop their skills will find plenty of content to help them take that next step.

The platform is made up of 28 separate modules across two broad subject areas - Hunting Essentials and Firearms Essentials.

Hunting Essentials includes NZ specific outdoor and hunter safety and skills with everything from weather

forecasting, navigation, river crossing, first aid, preparation, access, game animal management and other bushcraft and hunting skills.

Firearms Essentials is about learning safe and successful firearms use. This includes maintenance, sighting in, storage and transport, and technique.

Better Hunting also includes skill-building games, digital trip intentions, ballot calendars and more.

Better Hunting is free to access at www.betterhunting.nz and can be used on a laptop, tablet or phone. Courses can also be accessed offline through the free mobile app. The platform saves your progress as you go so you can dip in and out as often as you like. Just create an account and get learning.



Firearms Registry

More than 100,000 firearms have now been entered into New Zealand's new Firearms Registry.

Licensed firearms owners across the country have responded well to the Registry, with it taking just 7 months to get to the 100,000th firearm recorded into the system. This is from nearly 10 percent of the approximately 235,000 licence holders in New Zealand.

Te Tari Pūreke - Firearms Safety Authority Executive Director Angela Brazier says she'd like to thank all responsible firearms owners who have filled in the Registry since it launched on 24 June 2023. So far, Canterbury is the area with the highest number of firearms registered, it's also the area with the most licence holders.

"The Firearms Registry is all about preventing firearms getting into the wrong hands. Digitising the licensing system enhances our ability to detect unlawful and criminal activity.

"Along with preventing the sale and purchase of stolen firearms, the Registry provides a better way for Police to trace where firearms used by criminals have come from."

Disrupting the flow of firearms to criminals works in tandem with other Policing initiatives that target organised criminal groups and gangs. These separate but complementary strategies are together making it harder for criminals to possess and use firearms. They are making our communities safer.

"When fully rolled out, the Registry will provide a picture of all lawfully held firearms and arms items in New Zealand. This will give greater transparency when firearms are changing hands and ultimately make the availability of firearms to the black market more difficult," Ms Brazier says.
